A LPO is 'any person responsible for the protection of assets, people and property from harm, theft and damage where losses can occur'.

Common job functions include large chain stores and shopping centres, plain clothes surveillance.

The program examines procedures and skills for working as a Loss Prevention Officer in a retail environments. Includes theft analysis, surveillance, dealing with offenders and arrest procedures.

Security Screening

Covers establishing a screening system, electronic screening methods, physical screening of people, baggage and vehicles.

Armed Robbery Prevention & Management

This program is important for anyone who works in an environment where armed robbery is a possibility, such as gaming venues, static guards at banks, convenience stores, etc; includes workplace awareness and prevention strategies and post-event management and reporting.

Security Operations II

Certificate II in Security Operations

Licensing in unarmed security guard and crowd control begins at AQF 2 level, with 7 core units plus electives specific to the job function. (Code: CPP20207)

There are 7 core units common to both streams:

- Communicate effectively in the security industry
- Follow workplace safety procedures
- Work effectively in the security industry
- Work as part of a security team
- Provide security services to clients
- Apply first aid

Unarmed Security Guard

Definition: 'A person employed or retained to protect, watch or guard any property whilst unarmed'.

Common job functions include static guard, mobile patrol, shopping centre, airport security, security gatehouse.

7 core units plus 6 additional elective units:

- Control access to & exit from premises
- Operate basic security equipment
- Patrol premises
- Use communication systems
- Manage conflict through negotiation
- Protect self and others using basic defensive techniques

Note: units common across various certificate streams count as credits in attainment of qualifications.



Security Operations II

Crowd Controller

Definition: 'A person employed or retained principally to maintain order at any public place by screening entry into, monitoring or controlling behaviour in, or removing any person from, or otherwise maintaining order in any such place, unless that person is doing nothing more than securing or checking that persons allowed admission have paid to be admitted or have invitations or passes allowing for admission'.

Common job functions include licensed venues, gaming rooms, private functions, concerts, sporting events, exhibitions.

7 core units plus 10 additional elective units:

- Monitor & control individual & crowd behaviour
- Manage conflict through negotiation
- Apply procedures for responsible service of alcohol
- Protect safety of persons
- Control access to & exit from premises
- Operate basic security equipment
- Prepare/present security documentation/reports
- Plan & conduct evacuation of premises
- Protect self and others using basic defensive techniques
- Control persons with empty hand techniques

License Eligibility

To be eligible for a security license you must:

- ☞ Be at least 18 years of age
- ☞ Be of good character
- ☞ No recent criminal convictions
- ☞ Completed the required training program

Requisites also exist for use of force options within the industry, such as batons, handcuffs and firearms.

Security Operations III

Certificate III in Security Operations

Licensing in armed security guard and bodyguard begins at AQF 3 level, with 9 core units plus electives specific to the job function. (Code: CPP30407)

There are 9 core units common to both streams:

- Contribute to effective workplace relationships
- Organise personal work priorities & development
- Maintain workplace safety in security industry
- Manage conflict through negotiation
- Determine response to security risk situation
- Prepare/present security documentation/reports
- Coordinate quality security service to customers
- Maintain security of environment
- Apply first aid

Armed Security Guard

Definition: 'A person employed or retained to protect, watch or guard any property whilst being armed with a firearm'.

9 core units plus 6 additional elective units:

- Prepare & present evidence in court
- Plan & conduct evacuation of premises
- Control persons using empty hand techniques
- Control security risk situations using firearms

Additional units as a condition of licence to carry:

- Control persons using batons
- Restrain persons using handcuffs

Bodyguard

Definition: 'A person employed or retained to provide a close personal protection service'.

9 core units plus 5 additional elective units:

- Control access to & exit from premises
- Monitor & control individual & crowd behaviour
- Plan & conduct evacuation of premises
- Provide for safety of persons at risk
- Control persons using empty hand techniques
